

## GEETHANJALI

Housed in a 200-year-old French bungalow in the French quarter of Pondicherry is an antiques store founded and run by a third-generation antiques dealer who goes, simply, by 'Vikneswaran'. Geethanjali curates and deals in authentic artefacts and rare period furniture of (mostly) south Indian and Asian origin. These two trays are one of the many examples of Burmese lacquerware available at the store. Made in the early part of the last century, the bases are made of wood and bamboo, and are lacquered and hand-painted with vegetable pigments.

## PHILLIPS ANTIQUES

Theyyam, a ritual form of worship in parts of Kerala and Tamil Nadu, loosely translates into 'dance of the gods'. This richly coloured Theyyam face mask is hand-carved out of local hardwood and is meant to represent Vettakkoru Makan, a deity believed to be the son of Shiva and his consort Parvati. Available at Phillips Antiques, this mask (and others like it) is part of the collection at the four-generations-old family business that deals in Indian furniture and artefacts.
